# Department Spotlight



Technical Services orders, catalogs, and processes nearly all of the physical items that come into the Library. The team also orders and catalogs all digital items including ebooks, eaudiobooks, and catalogs all incoming Government Documents.

When patrons call the Library, they can expect to speak with a friendly Technical Services staff member before being connected to the party they wish to locate.

If an item has minor damage, Technical Services also mends items and cleans DVDs, CDs, and game discs.

Technical Services is composed of one supervisor who oversees three full-time and four parttime staff members.

#### Jólabókaflóð for Kids




