From the Director Jeff Collins

Hello, and thank you for your continued support of Davenport Public Library! Here's what we've been up to throughout 2022. Our staff has shown remarkable resilience throughout this year of transition. As the world continues to move toward a post-pandemic normal, our community responded by visiting our libraries, using our study and meeting rooms, attending high-quality library programs, and borrowing lots of library materials. This year was punctuated by a significant leadership transition, as the Library Board of Trustees hired me to take the reins after Director Amy Groskopf retired following a career that spanned more than 33 years of service.

I hit the ground running in February and was fortunate to work with and be trained by library employees who continually impressed me with their knowledge, work ethic and passion for the public we serve.

Staff highlights:



Brittany Peacock (Community Outreach and Marketing Supervisor) became President of the Association of Bookmobile and Outreach Services (ABOS), a national organization that supports library staff and leadership.

At the Iowa Library Association (ILA) Annual Conference, two Davenport Public Library employees received awards: Amber Carlson (Youth Services Librarian) received the ILA Youth Services Quality Time Award and Quinn O'Brian (Library Social Worker) received the ILA Library Philanthropy Award.





Quinn and Leslie Ross (Information Services Supervisor) presented at the ILA Conference on the role of social workers in public libraries. Speaking of Quinn, she serves under a three-year contract funded through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) and helps patrons navigate a complex system of support and resources available in the community, addressing issues such as housing instability, homelessness, unemployment, food insecurity, and legal issues. In addition to providing one-on-one assistance, she has partnered with local community groups and assisted 934 patrons, while forging 44 partnerships with community organizations, since beginning her role.

Our staff continue to seek out ways to develop their talents and learn about how to best serve our public, as Brittany and Leslie completed the Davenport Strengths Institute in June after completing the 12-month leadership program.







Rachel Rugg (Information Services Librarian) participated in the 2022 ILA Leadership Institute in August.

A few more highlights:

We held an Open House on September 30th to celebrate the \$1.8 million renovation of | Main and the launch of the Library's first makerspace, Studio 321. The renovation was made possible through generous donations from our community and the FRIENDS of the Davenport Public Library, resulting in new study rooms, more comfortable seating and charging stations, ADA-accessible restrooms, and other infrastructure improvements. We also updated numerous furnishings at Fairmount, especially in the children's area, and partnered with River Bend Food Bank to designate a community snack pantry for area youth. In addition to our role as a participating summer meal site for Davenport Community Schools, the Library is helping to feed kids both physically and mentally.





The 2022-2024 Strategic Plan framed much of our work toward achieving goals and objectives in the following areas: 1) Improving marketing; 2) Better reaching underserved communities; and 3) Better engaging underserved or underrepresented communities in our facilities. We created a Brand Guide and Marketing Plan, updated our organizational structure, developed a new printed monthly calendar to spotlight library events, and implemented new workflow efficiencies, such as Patron Point – a marketing automation platform that helps us engage with and retain patrons, while making it easier to attract new patrons.

We worked with the City of Davenport Community Economic Development and Parks and Recreation to expand our Literacy Outreach Program. This funding allowed us to hire two part-time temporary Library Assistants during the summer and a full-time Library Assistant for the school year to offer literacy programs to children in low- and moderate-income neighborhoods. Our Outreach team attended community events, including the Fejervary Family Fun Days, the MLK Center Juneteenth Celebration, the QC Unity Pride Parade, Yoga and Stories in the Park at VanderVeer, and more!





We offered engaging and responsive programs that reflect the diversity of our community, including Make the Connection: A DEI Bookclub, which virtually hosted Brittany K. Barnett, who authored the best-selling book A Knock at Midnight: A Story of Hope Justice and Freedom, the Quad Cities Deaf Resource Fair, and the Teen Summer Brunch: Drag Queens & Kings program, which offered teenagers a safe place to explore our diverse world. Many programs were offered virtually, in-person or off-site – we even hosted an event in a mine! In addition to our annual Summer Reading Program, we continued reading challenges year-round to help patrons stay engaged, including the Hispanic Heritage Month Reading Challenge, Teen Reading Challenge, and Native American Heritage Month Challenge this fall.

In short, it has been an amazing year. I am proud of what we've accomplished together and excited for what comes next. Here is a sneak peek at a few upcoming initiatives:

- \$1.08 million-dollar project to enhance the children's areas at all three Davenport Public Library locations
- Accessibility and landscaping improvements at | Main
- Fairmount Community Center
- New meeting room tables and other furnishings at |Eastern
- Student Library Card program in partnership with Davenport Community Schools

We are thankful for the wonderful support of the Library Board of Trustees, FRIENDS, Mayor and City Council, City Administrator and City employees, and especially our community. I'm excited to serve as we work together to fulfill our mission to connect a diverse community to resources that inform, enrich, educate, and entertain!

The winning schools were honored by the Mayor and City Council during a council meeting in October. The schools also received a trophy along with free books for their school library.
