The Architect:

Frederick George (Fritz) Clausen (1848-1940) was born in Germany and came to Davenport, Iowa in 1870 after receiving his education and training in architecture. Clausen's first job was as a draftsman for T. W. McClelland, a contractor-builder. He then established his own practice after only one year with his firm growing until his retirement in 1914.

The Proprietors – Beiderbecke & Miller. Wholesale Grocers.

Frank H. Miller (1836 -) came to Davenport from Indianapolis in the spring of 1856 and went into partnership with his brother in a grocery business at the corner of Gaines and Second Streets. Charles Beiderbecke, a friend of Miller's from Indianapolis, visited Davenport in the fall of 1856, bought out Miller's brother and the Beiderbecke & Miller partnership began.

During the early lean years, the partners also ran a vinegar factory which enabled them to financially make ends meet, until a fire in 1862 destroyed their store and factory. They rented a building three blocks west and
